

**London Songs: Big Ben (Tune from the
Westminster Quarters)
Activity
Key Stage 2**

Time Taken: 1 hour (Approx.)

What you need:

Thin card (a cereal box or similar size)

Big Ben print out

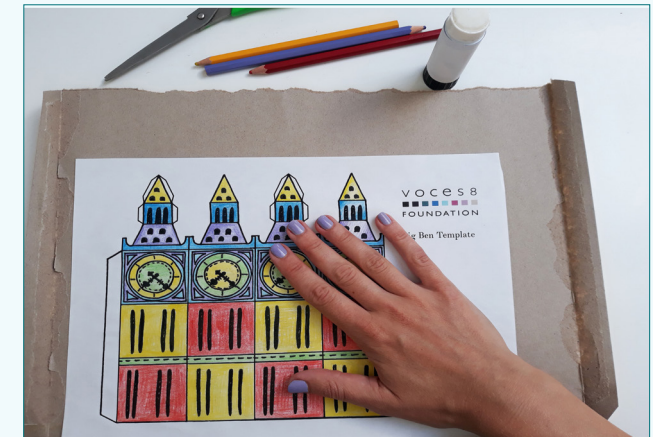
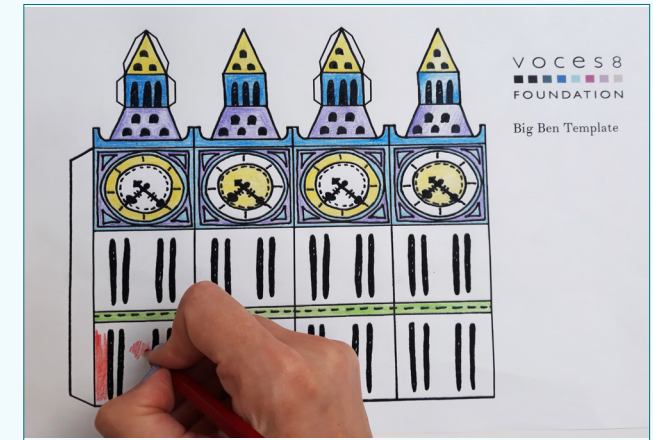
Coloured pens or pencils

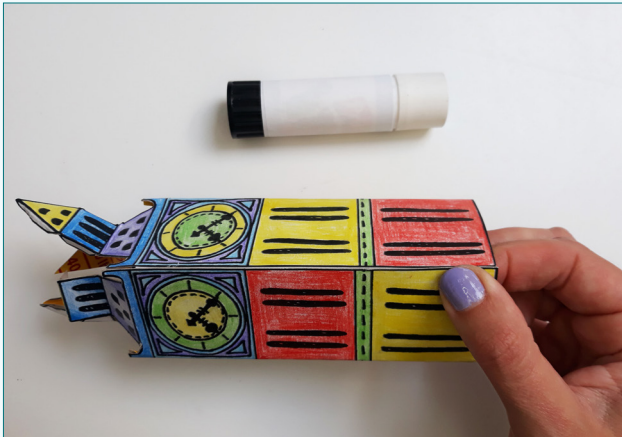
Scissors (get an adult to help you if you need to)

Glue stick/sticky tape

**Make Your Own Big Ben From Paper
and Card**

1. Print out the Big Ben template sheet, or get one from your teacher.
2. Colour in the template however you like using coloured pens, pencils, paints, or whatever you have. You can make it lifelike or use lots of different colours. Use your imagination to create something you think goes with the song.
3. Stick the paper picture to the card using a glue stick. Make sure the all edges of the template have glue on them, as you will be cutting around them next.
4. Cut carefully around the edges of the template. The top might be quite fiddly to cut around. Ask an adult to help you if you find it hard. Once the template is cut out make sure that all the edges are properly stuck down using the glue stick.





5. Fold along the lines as in the picture. You will need to fold all the tabs towards the back of the cutout and fold the sides down the main lines to form a square shape. Use the picture to help you fold the top of the model.

6. Glue along the long side tab and stick to the inside of the opposite edge. You can secure it with a paper clip or clothes peg whilst it dries if it won't stay in place.

7. Glue along all of the little tabs at the top and stick together as shown in the picture. This might be quite fiddly. Ask an adult to help you if you find it hard. You can use tape to secure the top if glue is too messy.

8. Your model is finished. Well done!
